



# It's Pink's romance-revival tour

Lucky for Pink, her husband has a sense of humour: US motocross champion **Carey Hart** will hear his wife call him a "tool" every night during her upcoming 50-show Australian tour when she performs her hit song So What.

"You gotta laugh at it," Hart tells Insider. "If you can't laugh at yourself, who can you laugh at?"

"She let me know what was going to happen ahead of time and I thought it was hilarious.

"I feel like I've got a pretty good sense of humour so you can't take that stuff too serious."

The couple recently reconciled after splitting last year and will spend the next few months touring Australia together to rekindle their romance.

"We're definitely in a rebuilding phase right now," Hart says. "It's got to kind of start from somewhere.

"I think that's the goal right now — get a start and just move forward.

"It's not about labels or titles or any of that stuff, it's about spending time together and focusing on living happily

ever after."

On her latest album, *Funhouse*, Pink makes several references to her separation from Hart.

But it's most evident — and most public — in the single *So What*.

In that song, Pink sings: "I'm all right, I'm just fine and you're a tool; So, so what, I'm a rock star; I got my rock moves and I don't want you tonight."

One of the biggest problems for the pair during their three-year marriage — they never actually divorced — was coordinating their busy schedules.

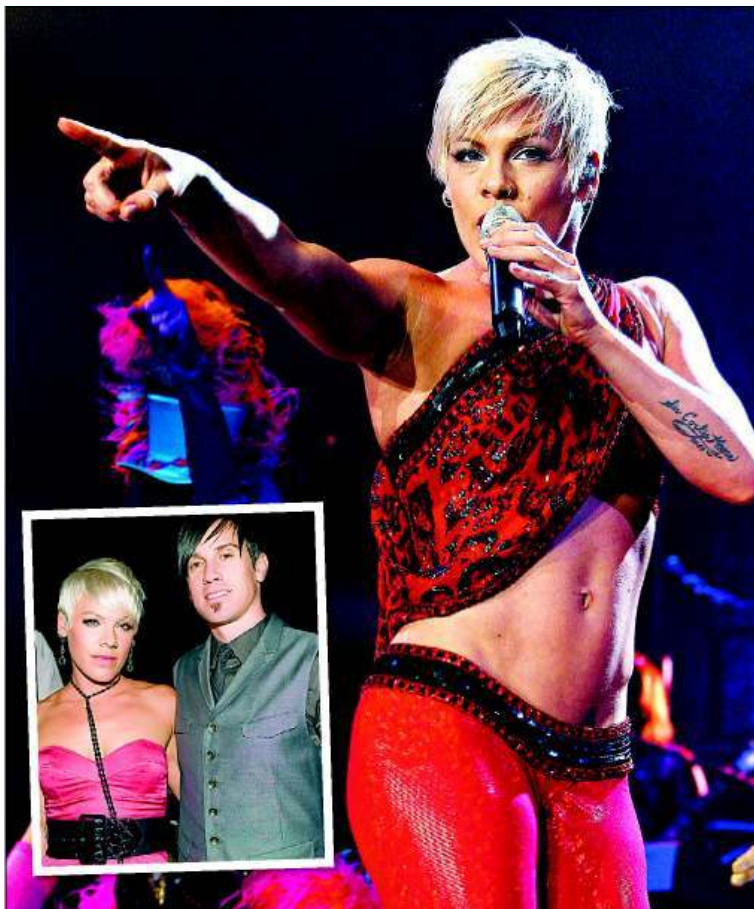
It became difficult for them to be in the same place at the same time.

So now they're touring together, with the couple set to run a string of free "lifestyle events" around Australia.

These "Hart and Huntington Freestyle Tour" events will feature free entertainment and a freestyle motocross show.

They will coincide with selected stops on Pink's tour which kicks off in Perth on May 22.
